## Introduction

Humankind employs around 1100 staff and has over 70 different premises. We see well over 20,000 people in our services each year. Our services have remained open during the COVID-19 pandemic. We provide health and social support to a range of vulnerable people across England, including both housing and clinical services.

## Purpose of Document

This risk assessment covers the whole of Humankind Charity. The risk assessment details the actions that each workplace and team is taking to ensure compliance with the requirements of the Health & Safety at Work etc Act 1974, other Health & Safety legislation and the government guidance for working safely during the COVID-19 pandemic.

#### **Key Principles**

- The safety of our service users, staff, volunteers, partners and stakeholders is paramount
- We follow all applicable Government advice relating to COVID-19

#### For our staff these principles apply

- If you can work from home you should do so.
- If you cannot work from home you should maintain social distancing.
- Where social distancing cannot be maintained follow risk assessment guidelines for activity undertaken.
- Good hygiene; thorough, regular handwashing, appropriate infection control and social distancing are the responsibly of all staff and must be adhered to at all times.

- We have a COVID-19 specific risk register in place which applies to the whole organisation
- We have a dedicated core COVID-19 group which meets weekly, led by members of the Executive Management Team
