Term Two	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Implement positive LGBT+ inclusion appropriate to your setting• Submit two sections for review
Term Three	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Implement positive LGBT+ inclusion appropriate to your setting• Submit final three sections for review
